NEW DATABASE — ECONOMISTS' VOICE



LIBRARY FEATURES

Go to www.pointpark.edu to get to the <u>Library</u> link

To access databases and online books from off-campus computers, use the off-campus links and sign on with your Point Park email username and password

There are 35,000+ ebooks available through the library. Access them through Pointcat-the Online Catalog or through Ebrary in Online Resources and Databases.

One Search searches it all! Use One Search to search most of the library's databases and the online catalog at the same time.

Order books from other academic libraries through <u>EZ-Borrow</u>.

The Economists' Voice is an online journal database providing "a nonpartisan forum for economists to present innovative policy ideas or engaging commentary on the issues of the day. Readers include professional economists, lawyers, policy analysts, policymakers, and students of economics." A publication of the Berkley Electronic Press, students and faculty gain access to full-text, peer-reviewed articles written in language plain enough for even the general reader. Updated continuously, the journal offers new information on current issues discussed by economists. The database content ranges from Volume 1, Issue 1, September 2004 to the present.

Features of Economists' Voice

- Create a personalized account simply by clicking on the "My Account" tab at the top of the page and entering basic personal information in the form provided.
- "Bealerts" allow you to sign-up for email notifications of new articles based on personally selected criteria and areas of interest.
- Enable RSS feeds allowing for notification of newly posted articles in *The Economists' Voice*.
- Standard search options are available for simple browsing of publications or searches of specific interest.

WHAT IS PEER-REVIEW???

As you consider the research paper you are going to write, remember you want the best information you can find. How will you know if a resource is reliable? Scholarly journal articles are refereed, or peer-reviewed, which means before an article is accepted for publication in a scholarly journal, it is read and critiqued by experts in the field. These experts decide whether or not an article is fit for publication. If the article is not immediately publishable (or outright rejected), changes or improvements may be necessary. The process of assessment ensures that a work is relevant, effectively communicated and conveys reliable information. In other words, peer-review is a form of quality control.

How will you know if an article has been peer-reviewed?

Sometimes a database will inform you. By clicking on its "About" page, it may tell you about the contents of the database and therefore whether or not the articles it contains are peer-reviewed. Some databases allow you to limit your search results to peer-reviewed articles. EBSCOhost allows you to do this by checking the appropriate box.

As a general rule, scholarly publications contain peerreviewed articles and you can most often tell a scholarly journal by its title, *Journal for Cultural Research*, for example. *Time* magazine, for instance, is not peer-reviewed.

If you are still uncertain, you can look up the name of the journal in a database and it should tell you if it is peer-reviewed or not.
