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How does Point Park University's CTTP Certification Program differ from other Career and Technical Certification programs?

- As new Career and Technical educators progress to transferring their knowledge and practice in the field to their students in the classroom, this certification program focuses initial coursework on the immediate needs of the Career and Technical classroom educator.
- Course content, as well as required assignments and assessments, are designed to be applicable
 to the classroom environment and reflect "practice in action."
- Career and Technical educators work to obtain proficiency of PDE competencies and course objectives in a "learn by doing" model, with specific feedback for improvement from faculty.
 Career and Technical educators continue to resubmit required summative assessments, during each eight-week course term, until required levels of proficiency are achieved, thus maximizing the learning experience.
- The program is designed as an "asynchronous" Cohort model, thus enabling new Career and Technical educators from across the Commonwealth to enroll and learn during times agreeable to their personal schedules.
- The model allows Career and Technical educators to meet and engage with colleagues in Career and Technical Centers throughout Pennsylvania and provides the opportunity to meet weekly in a one-hour synchronous session with faculty and colleagues. Sessions are recorded for those unable to attend, or for those desiring information from the session.
- Objectives for the courses in the Career and Technical Instructional I Certification Program are
 aligned to PDE competencies, as required; however, specific course content, and activities and
 assessments are designed in collaboration with an advisory board of Career and Technical Center
 Directors. This collaboration provides assurance that new Career and Technical educators gain
 knowledge and can demonstrate proficiency in both competencies required by PDE and practical
 classroom applications necessary for quality teaching in a Career and Technical setting.

How long will it take for students to complete their Career and Technical Instructional I Certification?

• The Point Park University School of Education will offer one course, each eight-week term, as each Cohort begins. CTE Instructional I certification may be completed in one (1) calendar year with enrollment in the following courses:

0	Course I	EDUC 105	CTE - Introduction to Teaching

0	Course III	EDUC 107	CTE - Differentiated Instructional Methods
0	Course IV	EDUC 108	CTE - Assessment Strategies

0	Course VI	EDUC 110	CTE - Content Literacy

- The program is designed as a Cohort model, as students benefit from continuous learning, applicable to their growth as an educator. In addition, developing relationships with other colleagues in their cohort provides further peer support in their endeavor to become high quality Career and Technical classroom educators.
- The inaugural cohort began in January 2025. Additional cohort start dates for Instructional I Certification are anticipated in May 2025, October 2025 and January 2026, based upon interest and enrollment. Pending PDE approval, Point Park University intends to offer CTE Instructional II Certification in Fall, 2025.

Note: To the extent possible, Point Park University and the School of Education will work to accommodate individual student needs in course scheduling, including but not limited to appropriate course transfers from other universities and assessment of prior learning. Individualized review of transcripts is available to prospective students at no charge.

May students choose to take the courses outside of the Cohort model recommended sequence?

- Although the content of a single course is not dependent on specific knowledge from a
 previous course in the sequence, the Point Park University School of Education faculty has
 recognized the educational benefit of student learning in a cohort environment, thus the
 intentional design of the program considered the University experience with this model of
 learning.
- When personal/professional situations arise, which lead to a student being unable to follow
 the course sequence, Point Park University will strive to accommodate the student and
 provide a mutually agreed upon delivery of the program and courses, thus enabling the
 student to complete without delay.

May students transfer courses taken for Career and Technical Instructional I Certification at other Universities to the Point Park University, School of Education Career and Technical Teaching in Practice Instructional I Certification?

- Students who desire to transfer to Point Park University from another approved University Career and Technical Instructional I certification program will be entitled to receive a transcript and course review, at no charge.
- To be eligible for transfer to the Point Park University School of Education, Career and
 Technical Teaching in Practice Certification Program (CTTP), a course taken at another
 university must be aligned with the objectives and competencies of one or more of the
 required courses in the Point Park University approved program. Most courses taken in other
 university CTE programs are transferable to Point Park University. Contact Ashlee

 cost for a transcript review.
- Students may request such a review prior to enrolling in the Career and Technical Teaching in Practice (CTTP) Certification Program at Point Park University.

Will Point Park University offer the Career and Technical Instructional II Certification?

• Since the Career and Technical Teaching in Practice (CTTP) Instructional I Certification was approved by PDE, Point Park University has been collaborating with CTC Directors to develop a program for the required additional 42 credits needed for Career and Technical Instructional II Certification. Following PDE approval, students will be able to apply. Point Park University's plans to launch the program in Fall, 2025. The course requirements for CTE I Certification and CTE II Certification will lead to the ability for the student to attain an Associate Degree in Education from Point Park University. The student may choose to continue their education and earn their Bachelor's degree by successfully completing an additional 60 credits.

What is the cost per credit and per course for the Point Park University Career and Technical Teaching in Practice (CTTP) Certification Program?

• The **2024-2025 cost per course credit** for the CTTP program is \$514 per credit, plus a technology fee of \$40 per credit. All courses are 3 credits.

2024-2025 Tuition =
$$$514 \times 3 = $1542$$
; Technology Fee = $$40 \times 3 = 120 ; Total cost per course= $$1662$

The **2025-2026 cost per course credit** for the CTTP program is \$528 per credit, plus a technology fee of \$40 per credit. All courses are 3 credits.

 The Accounting Department of Point Park University works with schools who provide reimbursement for tuition and can invoice schools directly to avoid students being required to pay then be reimbursed.
