Caring for the dead

Receive the body, embalm, wash, dress, cremate, restoration, arrange burial, place in casket, do hair, do cosmetics, treat with dignity, reverence, and respect...

Be a focal point in the chaotic time of death, honoring their deceased loved one, giving them a safe place to express their grief, answer the call at any hour, walk them through the arrangement process, help make meaningful selections, house calls, organize honor groups, lead services...

Traits required

Respect for lives lived without any bias, selfless willingness to serve others on the worst day of their lives, compassion, creativity, understanding, strong work ethic, multi-tasking, planning, problem-solving, strength of body and spirit, ability to lead, humility...

But also...
