

As a Point Park honors student, you benefit from enhanced opportunities on campus and in the community:

- Lectures by guest speakers

- Cultural events and trips in the Pittsburgh area and to honors conferences across the country

A CAREER-FOCUSED HONORS EDUCATION

At Point Park, our early focus on developing practical skills and moving beyond them in creative ways will serve you well throughout your professional life or prepare you for graduate study. Our honors program students have accomplished this in a variety of ways, including the following:

- Honors students complete three one-credit supplemental course experiences. These supplemental courses have included service-learning projects, novel learning experiences (such as travel, research, teaching assistantships and more) along with enhancements to capstone courses. Honors program students are not charged for the additional credits.
- The Honors Student
 Organization provides honors
 students with multiple
 opportunities for community
 engagement, service-learning,
 and leadership. This student-run
 organization is one of the most
 active on campus, offering
 numerous programs and
 activities throughout the year.

- Sophomore, junior and senior honors students can apply to become mentors, enhancing leadership skills as they guide and assist new students who are transitioning to university life and the honors program.
- Honors students benefit from membership in regional and national honors organizations and have opportunities to serve on faculty-student committees and administrative task forces.
- 5 Honors students have completed and presented meaningful research at conferences and have been published in academic journals.
- Honors students have been elected to regional honors councils and have taken an active role in planning conferences, engaging with peers, and advocating for honors students and honors programs.

YOUR CREATIVITY LEADS TO RECOGNITION

As an honors student, you are encouraged to develop initiatives that reflect your interests and engage your intellectual curiosity. You can excel inside and outside the classroom while being recognized for achievements above and beyond traditional coursework.

As sophomores, juniors and seniors, honors students have the opportunity to apply for student assistant positions throughout the University that pay stipends each semester. Honors mentors receive book awards.





- Attending and presenting at the National Collegiate Honors Council and the Northeast Regional Honors Council Conference
- Contributing to and supporting local Pittsburgh cultural and professional events
- Supporting community partners and community events such as the Pittsburgh Great Race
- Engaging in robust student learning opportunities such as the Spring Honors Colloquium and Fall Forum
- Participating in and designing speaker and community engagement events devoted to the year's honors program theme

AS A NEW STUDENT, YOU ARE INVITED TO JOIN THE HONORS PROGRAM IF YOU MEET THESE CRITERIA:

- You were awarded a presidential or transfer presidential scholarship
- You have a 3.5 QPA from your prior educational institution

You must ACCEPT THE INVITATION with a statement of intent, submitted at PointPark.edu/HonorsAccept, to become an honors program student.

YOU CAN APPLY TO JOIN THE HONORS PROGRAM BY FOLLOWING THESE STEPS:

- Submit an application at PointPark.edu/HonorsApp
- Write a statement of intent
- Write an essay on one of the quotations listed on the application

That completes the application process.

HONORS PROGRAM CLASSES AND COMPLETION REQUIREMENTS

In recognition of your extra effort, as an honors student you can reserve your classes in advance of open registration each semester. You will work with your advisors and the honors program directors to ensure all honors program requirements will be completed upon graduation. You will also have an opportunity to customize your honors experience by working collaboratively with professors and exploring areas of interest more deeply through honors contract courses.

To complete the program, you must:

- Earn 21 honors credits, which includes completing honors-designated courses, honors contract courses, and three one-credit supplemental course experiences
- Maintain a 3.0 cumulative QPA overall
- Maintain a 3.5 cumulative QPA in honors-related courses
- Work collaboratively with professors in honors contract classes as needed

TRANSFER STUDENTS

Transfer students who have completed honors classes with a "B" grade or higher at other colleges may be able to transfer up to nine credits as honors classes. For more information, contact the program director.

My participation in Honors Program events and activities has enriched my experience at Point Park because I've learned about different local groups like the Western Pennsylvania Conservancy. It was fascinating to learn about who cares for and manages the trees throughout the city, and their tree inventory workshop with us was my favorite event this year.
