2009-10 YEAR IN REVIEW

A deep Point Park team that returned four starters from the year before jumped out to a 7-2 record overall and 3-0 in the American Midwest Conference in 2009-10. The Pioneers mounted a five-game winning streak and won all three of their conference games in December to come out of the gate strong. Before the New Year arrived, Point Park had conference wins over Wilberforce, Houghton and Carlow and was tied for first in the conference at 3-0.

A mini, three-game losing streak included two losses to ranked teams at the Northwood (Fla.) Classic Dec. 29-30, but Point Park was able to get back on track with a 25-point win at Malone Jan. 14. The Pioneers blew a big lead in a disappointing home loss to Notre Dame (OH) on Jan. 16 and after a rout of Roberts Wesleyan on Jan. 18, the Pioneers endured a three-game, conference slide that saw their record dip to 9-9 overall and 5-5 in the AMC. That losing streak came at the end of a stretch that included five games in eight days.

The Pioneers split their next four games with wins at Notre Dame (OH) and home versus Ursuline and losses at Cedarville and at Mt. Vernon Nazarene, and they followed that up with three consecutive wins. The winning streak started with a narrow, 46-44 home win over Houghton that saw Point Park sweep the season series. The next two wins were routs of Malone and Carlow.

Entering the final weekend of the season, Point Park was 14-11 overall and 10-7 in the AMC, and the Pioneers needed only one more win to get into the AMC playoffs. Unfortunately, the Pioneers' season-ending trip to western New York ended with a couple of five-point losses at Daemen (64-59) and at Roberts Wesleyan (67-62).

The Pioneers ended up missing the AMC tournament by one game, but their 14-13 final record established the first winning season for the program in 16 years. Also, Point Park set a new high with 10 AMC victories. Point Park's top two scorers April Austin (14.7 ppg) and Ashley Henderson (13.1 ppg) were each named All-AMC second team.

SAM KOSANOVICH, Head Coach

5th season at Point Park, Alma Mater: California (Pa.) '74

Sam Kosanovich is in his fifth season as head coach of the Point Park University women's basketball team. He is the second-longest tenured coach in the history of the program. Since taking over the Pioneers in the spring of 2006, Kosanovich has given the women's basketball team a tremendous amount of stability from the head coaching stand point. Since his arrival, he has steadily laid a foundation for success, and after a few years to get the program on track, the Pioneers have enjoyed a turnaround over the last few seasons. Point Park had a record of 14-13 in 2009-10 to register its first winning season since 1993-94, and it has progressed from an American Mideast Conference also-ran to a team that is contending for the conference playoffs. The Pioneers missed the playoffs by one game last season, and under the direction of Kosanovich, they are poised to take the next step in the program's progression.

When Kosanovich was named the head coach of the Pioneers prior to the 2006-07 season, he inherited a team that had been led by three head coaches in four seasons. He had the benefit of all-conference player Charlisa Cummins that first season as Point Park had a respectable record of 12-16. The next season, the Pioneers suffered through a 2-25 record with a rash of injuries and young players being forced into prominent roles.

But Point Park experienced a big turnaround in 2008-09 as its 11-14 record was just a few games out of playoff contention. Heading into the final weekend of the season, the Pioneers had a chance to register a winning record.

As the 2010-11 season starts, Point Park will be looking for its first AMC playoff bid under Kosanovich and the program's first postseason appearance since 1998-99. Thanks to a roster that has been stocked with talented recruits from the last few years, the Pioneers have a good chance to breakthrough this year.

APRIL AUSTIN

Guard, 5-6, Sophomore

Hometown: Penn Hills, Pa. High school: North Catholic

Previous school: Univ. of Dayton

All-AMC second team 2009-10

Profile: Austin is in her second season at Point Park, and she led the Pioneers in scoring, assists and 3-pointers last year. An All-AMC second-team selection, Austin asserted herself as one of the top point guards in the conference last year. She set a school record in 2009-10 with 65 3-pointers, and she shot 37-percent from beyond the arc. Austin led the Pioneers with 14.7 points and 3.7 assists per game. This offseason, she had foot surgery, but she is expected to be healthy by the season opener. After an all-state career at North Catholic High School, she started her collegiate basketball career at NCAA Division I Dayton. She left the Flyers' program early in her freshman season, and she enrolled in the Univ. of Pittsburgh. Austin did not play basketball at Pitt, where she studied engineering for two years. In this her second season back in college basketball, she has the ability to further establish herself as one of the top players in the AMC.

2009-10: Austin started all 27 games and led the Pioneers in scoring 11 times in her first season at Point Park. She scored in double figures 21 times, which included four 20-point games and one 30-point game. Her career high of 31 points, eight steals and six 3-pointers came at Geneva. The six treys at Geneva tied a school record, and her 65 3-pointers on the year broke the previous school record by seven. Other big games included 28 points on 11 of 20 shooting at Notre Dame (OH), 27 points on 9 of 14 shooting vs. Roberts Wesleyan and 26 points vs. Midway. Austin ranked 14th in the AMC in scoring, fourth in 3-pointers made and fourth in steals with 75. Her 3.7 assists per game ranked eighth. Austin averaged 35 minutes per game. She played all 40 minutes in seven games, and she played 39 minutes in eight other games. Her career highs of nine assists and eight rebounds came in a 10-point effort at Northwestern Ohio.

High school: Austin was the Pittsburgh Post-Gazette's Class A Player of the Year as a senior in 2006-07. That year she was named to the PG's Class A Fab 5 team and the Tribune-Review Terrific 10. As a four-year starter, she scored 1,528 career points and was a first-team all-state selection as a senior. Austin led North Catholic to two WPIAL titles. In her senior year, she averaged 14.8 points, 5.4 assists, 4.3 rebounds and 4.2 steals per game in leading her team to the PIAA title game. **Personal:** Born Nov. 23, 1988...daughter of Damian and Sonja Austin...majoring in engineering.

Guard, 5-7, Senior

Hometown: West Mifflin, Pa. High school: West Mifflin

Profile: Bergman enters her senior season, and this is her fourth year on the Point Park women's basketball team. A reliable shooter from the outside and at the foul line, Bergman is shooting 31 percent from long range and 71 percent from the free-throw line during her career. Over the last three years, Bergman has given the Pioneers an outside shooting threat of the bench, and she figures to be in the role once again as a senior. She has played in 51 games with three starts. **2009-10:** Bergman played in 19 games and earned one start as a junior. Her season high of eight points came in the second game of the year vs. Midway when she hit two 3-pointers. She also hit two treys for a total of six points vs. Ursuline.

2008-09: Bergman played in 23 games and started one time. She was third on the team with 20 3-pointers and was also third on the team in foul shooting at 73.5 percent. **2007-08:** Played in nine games and made one start as a freshman before an injury from a car accident ended her season in December...shot 48 percent from the field and 39 percent from 3-point range...had 13 points on 3-for-3 shooting from long range vs. PSU New Kensington (Nov. 17)...made three treys and had 11 points in her only start at W.V. Wesleyan (Dec. 18). **High school:** A 2007 graduate of West Mifflin High School...was named to the Daily News Fabulous 15 team two times...won MVP honors of the Blue Devil Tournament as a senior...led her team in scoring. **Personal:** Born March 19, 1989...daughter of Scott Bergman...majoring in business management.

Dunmire gives the Pioneers an outside shooting threat off the bench. **High school:** Dunmire was a two-time WPIAL all-section player at Steel Valley High School. She earned four letters and was among the WPIAL leaders in scoring when she averaged 13.7 points per game as a junior. She is the daughter of Rick Dunmire, who formerly coached the Steel Valley boys' basketball team. **Personal:** Born May 11, 1991...daughter of Rick and Robin Dunmire...majoring in math education.

Profile: Henderson's senior season will be her third year in the Point Park women's basketball program. She has started all 52 games the last two seasons after beginning her career at NCAA Division I Pittsburgh and Canisius. Her career averages at Point Park include 14.3 points and 5.2 rebounds per game and 41% shooting from the field. She has positioned herself as one of the top guards in the AMC as her size and athleticism create mismatches for the opposition. A two-time all-conference selection and the AMC Newcomer of the Year in 2008-09, Henderson has the potential to progress her game even further in her final season of college

basketball. She has 743 career points, which leaves her 257 shy of 1,000 for her career. **2009-10:** Henderson started all 27 games and averaged 13.1 points per game. Her rebounding average of 4.9 is tops among returning players this season. She reached double figures in scoring 18 times including 12 of the last 15 games. After a slow start to the season, she was averaging 9.8 ppg at the end of the first semester, but she averaged 16.3 ppg the last 15 games. Her career scoring high of 29 points vs. Daemen also included six assists and five rebounds. Henderson had 28 points, nine rebounds and five steals on 10 of 13 shooting vs. Ursuline.
