We lament the destruction that human activity has inflicted on the environment. Yet, the ecological crisis of our times compels us to question the assumption that there is a separate sphere called 'the environment' that humans act upon. There is growing recognition in the social sciences and humanities that this nature-society binary is at the root of the crisis in the first place. In this introductory course in environmental studies, we will explore the multiple and conflicting perspectives on the relationship between nature and society.
